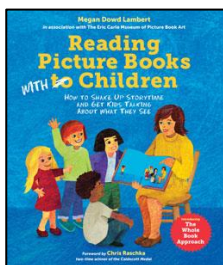

We also work with clients on books ranging from **Celebration** and **Tribute Books**, to poetry, essay, and art collections. Clients usually publish their books to give to friends and family; we assist clients with custom book websites if they request such services, but we are not otherwise involved in their commercial efforts.
