
Company purchase and assumption of duties, July 2019

I purchased this private publishing company from its founder, Kitty Axelson-Berry. My husband is company co-owner, and we oversee a staff of regular and freelance employees to offer clients interview, writing, editorial, genealogy, design, and production services under our company name and our imprint, White Poppy Press. Gross revenues have tripled under our leadership, and our staff size has expanded, with an average of 25 projects initiated per year.

Most projects are **Commissioned** (based on interview transcripts) or **Assisted Memoirs**, and **Family Histories** or genealogy books. We also work with clients on books ranging from **Celebration** and **Tribute Books**, to poetry, essay, and art collections. Clients usually publish their books to give to friends and family. We assist interested clients with setting up POD service and global distribution if they request such services but are otherwise uninvolved in their commercial efforts outside of a small shop page on our website that we opened in January 2023. My regular responsibilities include:

- Administration of office operations and vendor relationships
- Client communications, contracts, and billing
- Client interviews for Commissioned Memoirs
- Design oversight: preformatting; page proofs; consultation on layout and cover designs
- Editing client manuscripts: developmental editing; line editing; proofreading; research and writing; permissions
- Marketing & client recruitment: social media; blog posts; television and radio spots; print mailings; website updates; monthly e-newsletter; press inquiries, sponsorships
- Personnel supervision: hiring, oversight of 4 full- and part-time employees, plus 2–8 freelancers and interns annually
- Project administration & wrap-ups in coordination with the Director of Publishing and Bookkeeper
- Writing Services for (Advance) Obituaries, Ethical Wills, and other smaller-scale services
- Workshop offerings on writing (Advance) Obituary writing and Memoirs



In Spring 2018 I took a funded Professional Development Leave devoted to creative writing projects and studying the teaching of writing. I shifted to a 4/7 course-load during my final year of teaching, 2019–2020.

Courses: Criticism of Children's Literature; The Picturebook; The Child and the Book; Survey of Children's & YA Literature; A Whole Book Approach; Creators & Ideologies: Jacqueline Woodson; Special Topics: Visual Literacy & Visual Rhetoric.

Administrative & Service Duties: overseeing MFA students' mentorship placements with publishing professionals; planning biennial Children's Literature Institutes, including associated art exhibits in the Trustman Gallery; supervising Teaching and Research Assistants; advising Independent Studies; supporting program assessment; conducting admissions events at The Carle, and reviewing MFA and MFA/MA applications; academic advising for two dozen students annually; representing the university at professional conferences such as NESCBWI and ALA.
